

The Zeller & Choromokos Memorial Scholarships

The Ohio Valley Woodturners Guild has established 2 annual scholarship funds in the names of Dick and Donna Zeller and Earl Choromokos for their endless dedication to wood turning and the OVWG. The scholarships will be awarded to two different OVWG members each year, in the form of a grant up to \$500 each, to attend the woodturning school/teacher of their choice. All OVWG members are eligible for the scholarship.

The Zeller & Choromokos Memorial Scholarship will cover all tuition and lab fees, up to an amount of \$500.

Purpose of the program:

- To allow OVWG members to benefit from their own fundraising efforts and generous support.
- To provide educational opportunities that expand and enrich the entire woodturning community.
- To provide ways that these skills may be shared with local chapters, seminars, schools, and friends.
- To create opportunities for members who would otherwise not be financially able.

Eligibility

An individual applicant must be an OVWG member in good standing. Recipients must submit an acceptable report on their experiences within six weeks of their completion of the class for possible inclusion in the OVWG newsletter.

Selection Process

Each member of the Scholarship Committee will score each application on a scale of 1 to 7. The top scores will be awarded the scholarship. Emphasis will be placed on the ability, as well as the opportunity, of an applicant to share information gained, plus contributions to the OVWG. Economic need may also be considered.
