President's Letter

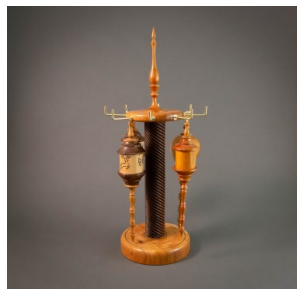

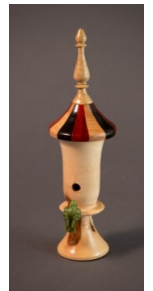

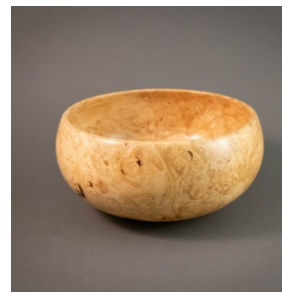
