Lowell will demonstrate his "my way" approach to making several of the following items-tool handle, mallet, sphere (with hints for baseball and owl face), scoop, ring and bangle.

Topic will include - the use of golden rectangles in design of the shape and inlay' techniques for carving a recessed grove and making epoxy clay tiles that conform to a turned 3D shape.


